We kicked off the year with some extremely fruitful events. In January, we partnered with Park Hill Church for a Garden Day where 20 academy students planted flowers, painted birdhouses, and helped beautify the school.

In February, we hosted our annual High School Winter Retreat in Big Bear. We studied scripture, broke into small groups, had fun in the snow, and 3 students led worship for the first time! Our elementary students also created 150 John 3:16 bracelets and 50 mirrors that read: 'You are made in God's image' for children in Tijuana.










Summer kicked off with a bang in May with Teacher Appreciation Week, where we served 25 teachers at King Chavez School with charcuterie cups and gifts. Also in May, the County of San Diego Health & Human Services Agency came and helped students learn about healthy eating and nutrition while teaching the students to make Veggie Tortilla Roll-Ups.

June was marked by our students creating and handing out 30 Homeless Care Packages: Evangelism Training by Pastor Miles McPherson from The Rock Church (resulting in 11 salvations in the classroom); a field trip to see the Inside Out 2 Movie; Park & Picnic Day; a middle school field trip to Belmont Park: and FutureSD Camp for middle and high schoolers. This resulted in 13 salvations of our HLA Students!









Summer continued with **Summer is Ours Events, hosted** by a collective of churches across San Diego. Every Friday night, for 3 consecutive weeks, our middle and high school students gathered with other churches for beach worship, inspiring messages, games, & more. They enjoyed a roller skating night, beach worship night, and summer block party. August also included a field trip to Dave & Buster's, a field trip to Sea World, and an end-of-summer bonfire to cap off a memorable season. Summer 2024 was one for the books!

We celebrated the end of a full and incredible year with field trips like Laser Tag, seeing Santa Fe Christian School's GodSpell Play, and a Thanksgiving Feast with our elementary students. We also hosted a Turkey Trot and gave out groceries, where we blessed over 100 families with a Thanksgiving meal.

December featured two of our most anticipated events of the year, including the Night of Hope Fundraising Gala.
